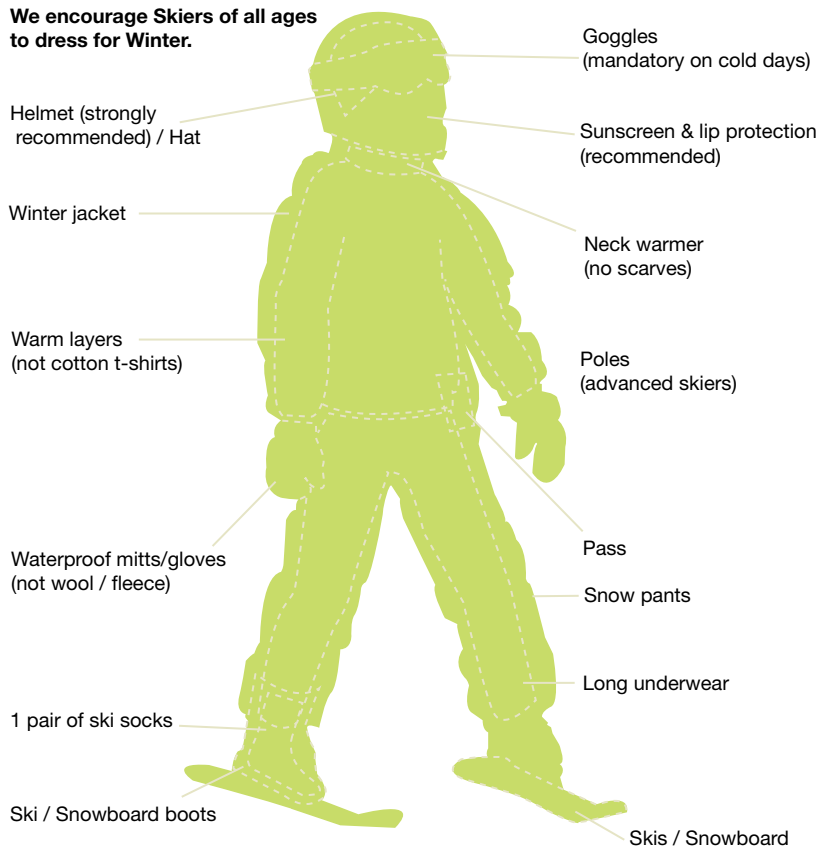

## NOTES FOR ALL PARENTS

We hope that your child's skiing experience will be a fun and positive one. Please find the following helpful tips and information to ensure a great experience:

Classes start at **10:30 am** and **1:30 pm** promptly, please have your child ready and at the meeting area on time;

Take the time to bring your child to the washroom before every class;

### **DRESS YOUR CHILD APPROPRIATELY WITH:**

- Neck warmer (no scarves) to cover cheeks;
- Waterproof mittens (no wool or fleece);
- One pair of **dry** ski socks;
- Warm moisture wicking layers (including turtleneck, long sleeved shirt, ski coat);
- Ensure ski boots fit properly and ski socks do not bunch inside the boot as this is painful and causes cold feet;

On cold days and high wind chill days your child **MUST** come to class with **ski goggles** and a **neck warmer**, in order to participate in the ski lesson;

Please pick your child up on time (12:30 pm and 3:30 pm), at the **MEETING AREA ONLY**

### **CHECK YOUR CHILD'S EQUIPMENT FROM TIME TO TIME:**

- Dry, properly fitted boots;
- Tuned skis/snowboard;
- Functioning bindings (ensure boots fit into bindings);
- Poles that are not bent and have baskets.

Children are encouraged to wear helmets that are properly fitted and **allow a clear field of vision**;

Ski poles are required by All Mountain Ski participants. Ski Wee does not require ski poles.

### **LATE ARRIVALS:**

While we appreciate there are always unforeseen circumstances, it is not guaranteed that students arriving late will be able to participate in their lesson. Please plan accordingly, leave enough time to park, pick up rental equipment, and prepare for your lesson.

The last day of classes will be on **March 6th** and **March 7th**. Your child will receive an evaluation and pin on these days. If your child is absent, the evaluation and pin will be left at Customer Services in the main lodge.

## **SKI WEE**

(ages 4 – 6): The supervisors for this program are Stephen Waxman, Yolanda Gaiarsa, and Michael Lewis. Please do not hesitate to find one of us should you have any questions or concerns.

- On the first day of the program, once the children have settled in with their instructors, parents are asked to stay in the Ski Wee meeting area to meet the Supervisors for a brief information session.
